As the first organization formed with a specific focus on prosthodontics, the Academy has a long history of landmark accomplishments that includes founding the American Board of Prosthodontics, developing the Glossary of Prosthodontic Terms, co-founding the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry, playing a key role in the introduction of contemporary implant dentistry to the profession, initiating outreach programs that provide prosthodontic care to the underserved, sponsoring or participating as a key contributor to strategic symposia in prosthodontics, and facilitating the emergence of evidence-based dentistry.
