Title

Prosthetics to Enhance Surgical Prognosis

Abstract

Head and neck cancer patients have to deal with multiple complications following their oncologic treatments. Particularly, surgical resections lead to various challenges both for the patient and for the restoring prosthodontist. This presentation will discuss the different surgeries and prosthetic reconstruction modalities that can be offered to patients.

She has held various positions in organized dentistry including Past President for the Association of Prosthodontists of Canada, Past International Director for the American College of Prosthodontists, and current Treasurer for the American College of Prosthodontists and President for the Canadian Dental Specialists Association. After working 10 years in Vancouver as tenured Associate Professor at the University of British Columbia and as a maxillofacial prosthodontist and Prosthodontics Provincial Practice Leader at British Columbia Cancer, she is now the Director of Examinations for the National Dental Examining Board of Canada.
