96th Annual Meeting of the Academy of Prosthodontics



'Grüezi' Everybody,

While May is still a few months away, the anticipation for our first-of-its-kind Annual Academy Meeting in Bern, Switzerland, is rapidly growing. I am extremely excited about welcoming everyone to my homeland and look forward to the superb scientific program David Felton and his Committee have put together. The social events will be equally as spectacular. Officers, Counselors and Committee Members are hard at work making the necessary arrangements and are superbly supported by the staff members of RES and CCDE, our

meetings arrangements partner in Bern. We could not do it without them. And our corporate sponsors have again been truly generous with their support.

As you know, the overall program will contain all the scientific and social events pieces customary to our annual meetings. Since we hope to attract many colleagues from Switzerland and neighboring countries, we have structured the Friday and Saturday program to what is customary to them, i.e., a full-day scientific session on Friday and a bit more than half a day on Saturday.

Only minutes from there, we will take the cable car up to the famous Schilthorn, where we will enjoy the spectacular views of the Alps and a typical Swiss dinner in the revolving restaurant 'Piz Gloria' amidst 200 mountain peaks!

The Friday spouses and guests tour will offer a visit to the Maison Cailler, one of the famous Swiss chocolatiers, and the picturesque medieval town of Gruyère, where the equally as famous Gruyere cheese is made. At the end of the day, fellows, spouses and guests are invited to a cocktail reception at the Congress Center hosted by the Swiss Society of Reconstructive Dentistry immediately following the afternoon scientific session.

On Saturday, spouses and their guests will have the opportunity to join a guided city tour of Bern. On this stroll through Bern's Old Town, guided by Bern Tourism's knowledgeable tour guides, you'll learn everything you wish to know about the city's 800-year history. The final highlight of the week will be the 'Prom' on Saturday night at the Hotel Bellevue, where we will experience the grand art of culinary hospitality in this classy traditional venue in the very heart of Bern's old town, just a short walk or tram ride away from the Congress Center. After 'no neck tie' in Hawaii, we will return to 'black tie optional' dress code for this one!






