The Future of Prosthodontic Education

Abstract:

A number of significant transformational changes are happening in dental education, health professions education, and higher education in general. Some are demographic and will impact the applicant pool to dental school and advanced education programs. Some are technological and impact the way that learners learn and teachers teach. Other trends relate to the expansion in the number of dental schools and the ways in which dental schools interact with their parent universities. The evolution of interprofessional education (IPE) and collaborative care in a changing health professions environment will lead to new ways of interacting with other health professions. This presentation will dive into these trends and propose ways in which they will impact the education and clinical practice of prosthodontists in the future
