Leading the Way: The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry

Abstract

The Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry, the oldest prosthodontic journal, was founded in 1951 by the Academy of Prosthodontics, American Prosthodontic Society and Pacific Coast Society for Prosthodontics. Although the Journal was founded by three North American prosthodontic organizations, it now has 27 domestic and international sponsoring organizations and is distributed world-wide. The JPD boasts an impact factor of 2.095. Over 1000 articles are submitted to the JPD annually, of which approximately 15% are published. Since its inception, Academy Fellows have served in leadership roles including Editor, Chair of the Editorial Council, and Directors of the Editorial Council.
