The Glossary of Prosthodontic Terms Committee continues to play a very important role in our specialty. Under the leadership of Fellow Danielle Layton, they continue to keep abreast of the latest changes in prosthodontics. They are currently addressing digital terminology, and its definitions and derivatives. Given MEDLINE Mesh is devoid of these terms, she and her committee may take on the larger task of addressing Medline indexes to guide the research community in how these terms may apply to research. This is a tremendous task and her committee should be commended for their work in

this extremely important contribution to the literature.

The History and Records Committee continues its great work to preserve our history through honoring our most valuable resource, our prestigious Life Fellows. The committee has shifted their focus to editing our precious video recording of Life Fellows. A treasure recently restored was a video of Life Fellow Tom Curtis, which had laid dormant since it was recorded in 2006 at the Grand Hyatt in San Francisco by Fellows Kent Knoernschild and Sree Koka. 

Summary of Interim Executive Council Meeting

The IEC meeting summary is outlined in this section, excluding the discussion mentioned in President Lisa Lang's message.

The current total AP membership includes 150 fellows consisting of 18 Associate Fellows and 75 Active Fellows (62% of membership), and 51 Life Fellows and 6 Honorary Fellows (38%). The importance of recruitment and cultivation of new leaders for the growth of the Academy was discussed. Personal invitation to the AP meeting by the AP president, to encourage the attendance of students and new prospective members, will be sent out annually.

The AP website, hosted by the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry, has been under revamping to include new functionalities that allow for the posting of digital posters. The past and future posters will be published on the AP website public domain annually along with the winners. In addition, updating the AP website format was discussed for easier navigation, a clear call to action, and a visually appealing design.

The past-president Lefebvre as chair of the AP resolutions and remembrance committee reported on the plans for the delivery of the eulogies. The upcoming annual meeting is the first in-person meeting since the COVID-19 pandemic. The eulogies of Drs. Ellinger, King, and Laney read during the AP virtual meeting will be published in the program book of the 2022 meeting.



Future Outlooks and Past Perspectives

One on One with Dr. Effrat Habsha, BSc. DDS. Dip. Pros. MSc.

Dr. Effie Habsha was born in Tel Aviv,
Israel, and emigrated to Toronto, Canada with her parents when she was 4. Her father and mother developed a business centred on the importing and sale

of hardware for the construction industry. Effice assisted with the retail aspects of the business from an early age and suggests that this is one reason that she has been so comfortable with the management of small components involved with implant restorations. She has the greatest appreciation and respect for the role model that her father provided as she grew up, and for the advice and guidance that she received as her career developed.

Effie Habsha has two sisters, one of whom went on to become an accountant while the other became a

lawyer much to their parents' satisfaction as this provided all the basic professional support that any family might need to access!

Effie attended private schools in Toronto followed by attendance at the University of Toronto (UoT) obtaining her general dental degree in 1995. It was during this time that she first met Academy Fellow Dr. George Zarb whose brilliant lectures encouraged her to apply for further prosthodontic training. This started with a summer studentship at the end of her doctoral degree that confirmed her interest in prosthodontics and led to acceptance into the graduate prosthodontic program based at UoT and the Mount Sinai Hospital resulting in prosthodontic specialty qualification in 1998. She regards Dr. Zarb's mentorship as having been key to her later accomplishments as he provided the support that allowed her to follow her own interests.

While attending UoT, Effie also encountered
Academy Fellow Izchak Barzilay who recognized her
talents and invited her to join his Prosthodontic
Associates practice in Toronto (PA). Effie describes

this professional relationship as being very close and supportive, enabling her to undertake teaching, research, activity in organized dentistry, and in provincial, national and international outreach including the PA initiatives in Uganda. Another example of her teaching and outreach activity has been the founding of Women in Dentistry: Work. <u>Life. Balance in 2010</u>. She admits that her own ability to maintain work-life balance has been a challenge. In her own words "I recognized that I cannot have it all at the same time and it's OK not to be at the top all the time". She has taken the longer view by placing emphasis on individual components of her life and career at different times recognizing that for her, investment in her chosen profession had to wait until later in life.

Family became a priority with the birth of her daughter, Eden, who is now 20 and hoping for entry to medical school. Mother and daughter are very close and support one another. (I could hear Eden in

the background of the office during our conversation, apparently coaching a high school student!) Her seventeen-year-old twin sons, Aaron and Jacob, appear to be preparing for careers in business and dentistry respectively, while her youngest son Liam (14) is still in school. One cannot help but feel that her strong role modelling may have resulted in at least two of her children pursuing careers in health sciences.

Now that the responsibilities of bringing up children have diminished, she is able to devote more time to teaching, lecturing and other activity in organized dentistry. Her social media posts speak to her frequent involvement with study clubs and major dental associations.

Effie appreciates her involvement with the Academy and observes from her experience with the AP Fellows that "great leaders develop great teams". She recognizes particularly the leadership contributions of the female AP Fellows who have had profound influence on clinical practice, education, research, administration, and publication.
